2022-2023 GOLF RULES & REGULATIONS:

The following Golf Rules are in effect for the entire calendar year. Wherever Member is referenced in this guide, the definition applies to an Active Golf Member and their family.

After careful consideration of Member concerns submitted to the management Team, we have instituted a code of conduct for Members, guests, and families to protect both the golf course and those who are on it. The following is a summary of positive, pro-active regulations developed to heighten your enjoyment of the course at Ancala Country Club. Members will be held accountable for violations up to and including, suspension of privileges or termination of membership.

GOLF RULES – HIGHLIGHTED FOCUS FOR 2022-2023 SEASON:

- Bringing outside alcohol on property/course is expressly forbidden.
- No member or guest of a member may take range balls from any practice facility for use on the golf course.
- No groups of greater than 4 players will be allowed.
 - All 5 players in the tee time will be held accountable if a fivesome goes on the golf course.
- Members must put player names into groups at the time of registration. The use of "X's" will not be allowed.
- Members, guests and family must follow the posted on course cart rules.
- All Ancala golf carts must occupy two players (Maximum of 2 Ancala golf carts per group). If a player wishes
 to take their own cart, it is subject to approval by the head golf professional and will result in paying a fee of
 \$60 for both seats.
- All members, guests, and family must follow the posted dress code regulations while on property.
 - This is highlighted on page 39
- Any player on a reservation, where the time of that reservation has passed, and who has not played will be subject to a "no show" charge of \$50 per person, for those who does not show.
- All private golf carts must be registered with the club by November 1st, 2022, to be allowed on property.
 - This includes signing the private cart agreement and paying the respective trail fee.
- Pace of play should not exceed 4 hours. You are expected to keep pace with the group in front of you throughout your round of golf. When necessary, a marshal will assist with helping groups keep pace throughout their round.
 - First time out of position, the group must improve pace of play within 2 holes.
 - Second time out of position, the group must pick up their ball and move up to the group in front of them.
 - Third time out of position, the group must leave the golf course.
- Respect of all members of the club and staff members by members and guests is expected, any verbal abuse or worse will be met with a zero tolerance policy.

TEE TIME RESERVATIONS:

- (a) The hours of golf course play, practice range hours and Golf Shop hours will be posted in the Golf Shop and are subject to change depending on golf course and weather conditions. The Golf Course Superintendent in consultation with the Golf Professional shall determine when the golf course is playable and such decision shall be final. No golf course play shall be permitted during any period that the course is determined not fit for play. In addition, when the golf course is closed, i.e., Mondays, there shall be no Member or Guest Play.
- (b) All players must be assigned a starting time through the ForeTees App. Starting times must be reserved through the ForeTees app. FULL Golf Members may reserve starting times up to seven (7) days in advance. Members may reserve only 1 starting time (no more than 4 players) per request.
- (c) LIMITED GOLF This membership entitles the Primary Member and his or her family as specified in Section 1.7 to unlimited golf course and Clubhouse access May15 through overseed. Golf course privileges are limited with access to one weekend-day per month with payment of customary guest rate overseed through May, plus 12 weekday rounds per month overseed through May 15. Reservations may be made five (5) days in advance. This membership also entitles the Member, and his or her family as specified in Section 1.7. to all privileges of the practice facilities, swimming pool, tennis and fitness facilities, and Clubhouse for the entire week except as Members' use of the Club is limited as provided in these Rules.

SPORT – This membership entitles the Member and his or her family to one weekday round per month with payment of a cart fee from overseed through May 15. All other rounds played during this time will incur the customary guest fee. May 15 through overseed the Member and his family will have unlimited access to the golf course with payment of a cart fee. Reservations may be made five (5) days in advance.

GOLF SOCIAL - This membership entitles the Member and his or her family to limited access of the golf course on Monday through Friday only, excluding Mondays on which tournaments are being held and holidays, from May 15 through overseed. Twelve weekday rounds overseed through May 14 may be acquired at the guest rate currently offered by the Club. Reservations may be made five (5) days in advance. This membership also entitles the Primary Member and his or her family specified in Section 1.7 to all privileges of the golf practice facilities, dining, swimming pool, tennis, and fitness facilities for the entire week except as Members' use of the Club is limited as provided in these Rules.

SOCIAL - This membership entitles the Primary Member and his or her family as specified in Section 1.7 to all Club social events and activities and unlimited access to the dining, swimming pool, tennis and fitness facilities. Social Members are not entitled to use of the golf course or practice facilities.

- (d) All starting times shall be assigned on a first-come, first-served basis, and must be made via ForeTees, the person making the reservation will be responsible for the tee time.
- (e) Players shall check in/register at the Golf Shop or with the starter at least 10 min prior to the scheduled tee time.
- (f) The golf course and practice facilities may be reserved for men's or women's play on certain days and during certain hours. Other players will be accommodated during these times on a space available basis only.
- (g) Specific golf course rules & restrictions are applied/published periodically and are available in the Golf Shop.
- (*h*) A Wait List will be active each day to help alleviate high demand of tee times. This Wait List is included on each day's tee sheet. Members are responsible for names and adjustments.

TEE TIME REGISTRATION:

All Members and guests must register at the Golf Shop or with the starter before beginning play. Members are responsible for the payment of all cart and guest fees before beginning play. All play starts on hole number one tee unless permission to the contrary is obtained from the Golf Professional Staff.

HANDICAP SCORE POSTING – REVISED 1/1/2022:

- (a) Under the Rules of Handicapping, a Handicap Index will update the day after a score(s) is posted
 - a. Players should submit their scores ASAP (the same day the round was played and before midnight). This ensures the score will be used in the playing conditions calculation.
- (b) For a player with an established Handicap Index, the max score for each hole is limited to a net double bogey, calculated as follows: Par of the hole + 2 strokes + Any handicap stroke(s) that the player receives on that hole* (*or minus any handicap stroke(s) that a plus handicap player gives back on that hole.)
- (c) Event Handicap revision dates will be determined by the Golf Shop.
- (d) A score may only be used for handicap purposes if, the round has been played over at least the minimum number of holes required for either a 9-hole or an 18-hole score to be acceptable, and if the player was in the company of at least one other person, who may also function as a marker. See below.

(e) In tournament play, particularly match play, a player may pick up his/her golf ball and not complete the golf hole. In this case, the player should post the score he/she most likely would have made. The most likely score consists of the following

Position of the ball	Strokes to be added
If the ball lies on the putting green and is no more than 5	Add one additional stroke

If the ball lies between 5 feet and 20 yards from the hole:	Add 2 or 3 strokes, depending on the position of the

(f) The USGA handicap formula may reduce a player's handicap due to exceptional play Rule 5.9. When an exceptional score is posted to a player's scoring record, the handicap index will be reduced in accordance with the following table:

# of strokes the score differential is lower than a player's handicap index in effect when the round was played	Exceptional scores reduction
7.0 – 9.9	-1.0
10.0 or more	-2.0

HANDICAPPING POLICIES & PROCEDURES

The Handicap Committee of ACC is a sub-committee of the Management Team and is responsible for ensuring compliance with the obligations under the World Handicap System (WHS) in accordance with the Rules of Handicapping and the USGA. The WHS expresses two basic premises: 1) each player will try to make the best score at every hole in every round, regardless of where the round is played, and 2) the player will post every acceptable round for peer review.

As a Handicap Committee, we will verify that acceptable scores are posted for handicap purposes and made available for peer review. The Handicap Committee may also perform random score audits and review members scoring records at least annually. In addition, the Handicap Committee provides guidance to club officials and other club Committees to establish the Terms of Competition for all applicable events at the club and to ensure players consistently have the ability to use their Handicap Index to compete, or play a recreational round, with anyone else on a fair and equal basis.

The Handicap Committee members for the 2022-2023 season are: Joe DiChiara

The Handicap Committee enforces these policies & procedures for all members wishing to maintain a Handicap Index with ACC:

- Maintain an active membership on the handicap roster of the club.
- Post all acceptable scores, including 9-hole rounds.
- Scores are to be posted within the same day of the round being played.
- Where applicable, proper adjustments must be applied to all scores for posting purposes, including net double bogey and most likely score.
- Each player will try to make the best score at every hole in every round, regardless of where the round is played.

What is an Acceptable Score?

- If 14 or more holes are played in an 18-hole round
- If 7 holes are played on a rated 9-holes
- Scores made in match play, stroke play and team competitions
- Scores made under Rule 3.2 when a hole is not played
- Scores made under Rule 3.3 when a player does not hole out
- Scores made if a player is disqualified from a competition but has an acceptable score
- Scores made when played by the Rules of Golf
- Scores made when played on a course during its active season
- Scores made in the company of at least one other person, who can also function as a marker

All acceptable scores are to be posted within the same day of play using one of the following methods:

• Score posting kiosk at the golf course | Mobile App | AGA Site | Returned to the golf shop for posting

A player must earn a Handicap Index. No player has an inherent right to a Handicap Index without demonstrating ability to our Golf Club's Handicap Committee. The Handicap Committee has the authority and obligation to adjust a Handicap Index if it feels necessary to do so. The Handicap Committee has the responsibility of making certain that each player has a Handicap Index reflecting potential ability.

Under the following circumstances, it may be necessary for the Handicap Committee to adjust the player's Handicap Index. However, the following list is not all-inclusive, and the Handicap Committee has the ultimate authority to adjust a Handicap Index under any circumstance that it feels necessary to do so. Before an adjustment becomes effective, the Handicap Committee will give the player an opportunity to explain the circumstances surrounding the proposed adjustment, either in writing or by appearing before the Committee. When an adjustment does become effective, it will be identified with the letter M, indicating that the Handicap Committee has modified the Handicap Index (e.g., 4.9M):

Improving Faster Than the System Can React

A player recently taking up the game may improve too rapidly for a Handicap Index calculated by the standard procedure to reflect potential ability (i.e a player who is practicing aspects of his/her game and/or taking playing lessons may not have a scoring record that exhibits potential ability & may need a Handicap Index adjustment)

- Numerous Away Scores Change Index
 - If a player's Handicap Index increases by 3.0 or more due to the posting of numerous away scores, and subsequent scores at ACC clearly indicate that the increased Handicap Index is too high, the Handicap Committee will adjust the player's Handicap Index downward.
- Temporary Disability

An increase in a Handicap Index will not be granted because a player's game is temporarily off, or the player has discontinued play. However, an increased handicap may be given for a temporary disability. The modified Handicap Index will be identified by the letter "M" to indicate that the Handicap Committee have modified it. For example, a player having had recent surgery may be given a modified Handicap Index while recovering.

- Player Manipulates Round
 - Examples of manipulating scores include the following:
 - (a) Posting erroneous information to the scoring record
 - (b) Stopping play prior to 7 or 14 holes to avoid posting scores
 - (c) Repeatedly playing more than one ball to avoid posting scores
 - (d) Not adjusting hole scores under The World Handicap System (i.e., failing to adjust to a net double bogey score on each hole before posting)
 - (e) Deliberately reporting more strokes than taken
 - (f) Deliberately taking extra strokes to inflate a score
 - (g) Not posting or not timely posting a score.

What are the possible Disciplinary Actions possible for failure to post or player manipulating their Handicap Index?

The Handicap Committee <u>expressly reserves the right to impose any disciplinary actions it deems fair and equitable</u>, depending on the severity, context and circumstances of the infraction. If a player is found to have violated the spirit and intent of the USGA/WHS handicap guidelines and rules, the Handicap Committee has the sole and independent authority to impose <u>any</u> sanction, including but not limited to: a verbal warning; a written warning; imposition of a penalty score and modification of a player's handicap (i.e. modify to player's 12 month low handicap index). In addition, the Committee may, in its sole discretion, impose a sanction/penalty on players who are repeat offenders or repeat non-compliant players.

For illustration purpose only and without establishing a requirement, the following are examples of how potential infractions may be handled:

- 1. First failure to post or potential manipulation of your score will (at a minimum) result in a verbal warning.
- 2. Second failure will (at a minimum) result in a written warning.
- 3. Third failure will (at a minimum) result in the appropriate penalty score issued for scores not posted
- 4. After a fourth failure to post your score or continued manipulation of the scoring record, further disciplinary action will be taken as the Handicap Committee deems fair and equitable.

The head golf professional or assistant golf professional at ACC can issue verbal warning(s) or written warnings(s) to any member(s) for failure to timely post his/her scores as required, without following the formal inquiry process below.

Formal Handicap or Golf Related Inquiry Process

All formal handicap or other golf related infraction inquiries regarding any ACC members (or guests) must adhere to the following requirements and procedures (with exception as noted above):

- 1. The inquiry must be in writing (verbal inquiries are not accepted) and at a minimum include:
 - a. The alleged infraction(s), all necessary information to investigate said inquiry (i.e., member at issue, dates, times, etc.) and all documentation in support of said inquiry.
 - b. The identity of the person making the inquiry (this will be kept confidential, but no anonymous inquiries will be accepted); **AND**
 - c. All the above must be hand-delivered and/or emailed to ACC Head Golf Professional, Joe DiChiara (jdichiara@ancalacc.com).
- 2. If an inquiry meets all the minimum requirements of Section 1, the Head Golf Professional shall timely send the inquiry and supporting documentation to the Management Team for investigation and review.
- 3. The Handicap Committee will provide the member in question with a summary of the inquiry and, before taking any action, the member will be invited to respond to the Handicap Committee either in writing or by appearing in person before the Committee. Said summary and invitation shall be emailed to the member at his/her email address on file with ACC.
- 4. The Handicap Committee will provide written notice to the affected member(s) of its decision and penalty, if any, no later than thirty (30) days after the initial written formal inquiry was received by the Head Golf Professional pursuant to Section 1. Said written notice shall be emailed to the member at his/her email address on file with ACC. All rulings will be at the discretion of the Handicap Committee. The decision of the Handicap Committee is final, unless the penalty includes a suspension of play.
- 5. If the penalty includes a suspension of play, the member shall have fifteen (15) days after receipt of said decision by the Handicap Committee to make a written request for a review hearing before the Club Manager and the full Management Team. The review hearing will be conducted within thirty (30) days from the date the member's request for hearing is made. Until the review hearing is held, the decision of the Handicap Committee shall stand. Following the review hearing, the decision of the Club Management Team shall be final and binding.

Operation 36 Program

The Golf Professional Staff at Ancala is excited to introduce this year's offerings in our Junior Golf Program. Ancala is proud to reintroduce the Operation 36 program to the membership. This program will focus on junior development in golf and getting them ready to play the course. The juniors are taught putting, short game, full swing and we will go onto the course. In the on course play each hole is a par 4 and beginners start from 25 yards. Once the golfer has mastered how to make 4 from the 25 yard tee markers then we will reward them by moving back to the 50 yard tee markers. Once they have mastered how to make 4 from the 50 yard tee markers then we will challenge the golfers from the 100 yard tee markers. This process continues until we are playing from the silver tees.

These programs will be held in 9-week semesters throughout the year. Each session will be 1 hour long and will consist of new topics and activities each week. Sign-ups will be posted before each semester and can be done through the Golf Shop.

TOURNAMENTS, RULES OF PLAY, & TIES

- (a) ACC reserves the right to make the golf course and practice range available for tournaments and clinics, at which time use by non-participants may be restricted.
- (b) Participation in any sanctioned golf tournament or event is defined in the Golf Guide.
- (c) Tournament play is restricted to Full Golf Members. The Head Golf Professional may open tournaments to Non Golf Members no more than one (1) week of the scheduled tournament if the event has not been filled.
- (d) Scorecards for tournament play at Ancala Country Club must be completed, signed, attested to by the opposing player(s), and turned into the Ancala Country Club Golf Shop immediately after completion of your round for verification. Golf Genius will be used as a form of live scoring only and will not be used to determine official scoring. If there are any discrepancies between scorecards and Golf Genius, the written scorecard shall be used.
- (e) If a tournament match is completed after the Golf Shop has closed, the player can drop the scorecard in the Drop Box next to the Golf Shop doors. If a scorecard is not turned in, the player or players may be disqualified from the tournament.
- (f) The entry fee for an event is subject to change depending on selection and cost of any food items, gifts, etc.
- (g) Cancellations that occur after a deadline are responsible for entry fee which covers food, tee gifts, and prizes
- (*b*) Music is allowed in ACC events however, the etiquette section in the USGA rules of golf says: "Players should always show consideration for other players on the course and should not disturb their play by moving, talking or making unnecessary noise. Players should ensure that any electronic device taken onto the course does not distract other players." if anyone else can hear "your music" while playing a stroke, it's too loud and is the duty of the offender to turn off the sound. If a player is asked to turn their music off, it must be turned off immediately and for the remainder of the round of golf, otherwise a penalty may incur.
- (*i*) If an event or league does not exceed the minimum amount of participation, the Head Golf Professional has the discretion to cancel the event and open the tee sheet for regular play.
- (j) Except for the Men's Member-Guest, tournament entry is on a first come first serve basis. If a tournament is over-subscribed, entries will be placed on a waiting list in the order they are received.
- (k) All tournament participants must have an established AGA/ USGA handicap index, unless the format of a given tournament allows for non-handicap participation.
- (1) The Head Golf Professional / Management Team has the right to modify the format event.
- (m) The ACC Golf Professional Staff determines the Handicap Revision Dates for each event.
- (*n*) No golf tournaments of any kind or play by any group of five (5) or more persons, shall be permitted unless approved in advance by the Golf Professional.

Tournament Awards

After each tournament, the winners' credit amounts will be entered into the credit book. Thereafter, when a member makes a merchandise purchase and requests to use the credit dollars, it is subtracted from the amount in the credit book.

Rules of Play

- (a) USGA rules will govern all play in conjunction with Ancala Country Club local rules.
- (b) All disputes will be settled by the tournament committee whose decision will be final.
- (c) The maximum handicap index that can be allocated to a golfer is 54.0, unless otherwise noted by the Golf Committee

Ties

Unless a playoff is specified in the rules of a tournament, ties will be broken by a scorecard playoff. The USGA recommended procedure of matching cards is as follows: the winner will be determined based on best total score for the last nine holes. If a tie remains, the winner will be determined based on the last six holes, the last three holes, and finally the 18th hole if necessary. If a tie still exists after following this method, the match of scorecards will go to the number one handicap hole and proceed until a winner is determined

GOLF CART & PULL CART USE

- (a) The use of golf carts on the golf course may be mandatory for all players during certain hours.
- (b) If a member wishes to use a private golf cart on property they must register it with the club. This includes signing the permit agreement which verifies the cart meets club standards and payment of the respective trail fee.
- (c) Golf carts are restricted to use on the golf course and practice areas. No golf carts shall be removed from the Club Facilities at any time without prior approval of the Golf Professional Staff.
- (d) Golf carts shall be operated only by persons sixteen (16) years of age or older with a valid automobile driver's license.
- (e) No more than two (2) persons are permitted on a standard golf cart, except in case of emergency, course evacuation or at the discretion of the Golf Shop.
- (f) Golf carts shall remain on cart paths on all par 3's and whenever else possible. Golf carts shall not be driven within fifteen (15) yards of any tee, bunker, or penalty area and fifty (50) yards from any green. Golf carts should be driven across fairways only at right angles, avoiding soft areas. Golf carts are not to be driven on mounds. Golf carts are to be parked on the cart path prior to putting or teeing on all greens and tees, golf cart traffic and directional signage must be always obeyed.
- (g) Golf carts are operated at the risk of the operator. The cost of repairing any damage to golf carts or the golf course resulting from improper operation will be charged to the Member in whose name the operator is playing at the time the damage occurs.

Pull Cart Rules

(h) Pull carts are allowed on property as long as they meet club standards.

Medical Flag Program Rules

- (i) To obtain a Medical Flag, a description of the ailment must be presented to the Golf Professional Staff.
- (j) There is a 30-foot (10 steps) no cart traffic perimeter around greens and carts are not allowed on any of the Par 3s.
- (k) There is a 15-foot (5 steps) no cart perimeter around teeing grounds.
- (*l*) On days when carts are free to go 90 degrees you must adhere to all golf cart traffic rules (including restricted areas).
- (*m*) On all "cart path only" days, carts are not allowed on fairways unless the golf cart must cut through the fairway which may only be done when it is necessary. There may be days when cart traffic will be limited to the cart path only with no exceptions when the carts may be allowed to travel to your ball on the fairways.
- (*n*) Medical Flag holders must avoid wet areas, ground under repair and high traffic areas, including collection areas around greens.
- (*o*) There are times when emergencies arise during play and the immediate need of a flag exists. The Golf Professional Staff will make this determination and coordinate with the Golf Maintenance Staff.

Pace of Play

- (a) All players are to maintain a reasonable pace of play. Specifically,
 - *a.* An 18 hole round of golf should be completed in no more than 4 hours, or no more than 10 minutes behind the preceding group if the pace is longer than the specified 4 hours.
 - *b.* Players are encouraged to play "ready golf ". If feasible, twosomes should join to form a foursome. The goal is to maintain pace with the group in front, not staying ahead of the group behind. Pace of play is a matter of golf etiquette and courtesy to other Members.
- (b) The Golf Professional Staff will have discretion to use their judgment and experience to administer to policy, taking into consideration conditions and situations.
- (c) If your group is off pace and out of position, the Golf Staff has the right to inform the group and ask them to speed up. Your group may be asked to let players play through or be instructed to pick up their balls and proceed to the next tee after two warnings, no questions asked.

PACE OF PLAY (& TIPS ON PLAYING FASTER)

Ancala Country Club is making a major effort to combat golf's greatest problem – SLOW PLAY. We believe that a round of golf should take no longer than four hours to complete.

Pace of Play Tips

- Play ready golf at all times.
- Be aware of your handicap and the maximum number of strokes you can take
- Arrive at the first tee 5 minutes prior to your tee time.
- Always keep pace with the group **in front** of you.





- 1. A Member must accompany his/her groups, per the schedule and times shown below, subject to the current rules governing the hours of guest play. All guests are subject to the Rules and Regulations of the Club, including the pace of play rules. Members are responsible for their guests' activities and behavior at all times, even when not in the accompanied foursome.
- 2. Hours of Guest Play

Tuesday-Friday

All Day (Leagues may affect start times)

Weekends/Holidays

After 11:00am for Regular Guests After 9:00am for Family Guests

3. No non-member or guest may play the course more than eight (8) times during a calendar year, excluding tournaments and outings.

EQUIPMENT & ATTIRE:

- (a) Every player must have a set of golf clubs. No sharing of golf clubs shall be permitted.
- (b) Shirts must be worn at all times on the golf course and within the social area of the Club. Men's shirts must have collars. Shorts must be a style specifically designed for golf. Golf shoes which follow the Club's posted spikeless policy must be worn on the course. Women's shirts must either have a collar or sleeves. All the following types of clothing are prohibited on the golf course: denim pants of all types and designs; short shorts, cutoffs, running shorts; tennis-length skirts; t-shirts, and tank tops. Only soft spike golf shoes or other approved shoes shall be worn on the golf course and practice areas. Any shoes other than golf shoes must be approved by the Golf Shop.

Golf Course Play

- (a) Jogging, bicycling, walking, skateboarding, walking of dogs, etc. are not permitted on the golf course or cart paths at any time. No fishing is permitted in lakes on the golf course.
- (b) All play shall start at hole number one tee unless permission to start elsewhere is obtained in advance from the Golf Shop.
- (c) In the event that play is involuntarily discontinued due to weather or closing of the course by the Golf Professional Staff, players will be issued a credit for golf charges based on how many holes were played.
- (d) Practice is restricted to designated practice areas.
- (e) Ball hawking is not permitted on the course at any time.
- (f) No wading into penalty areas or lakes shall be permitted. Balls may be retrieved only from banks of lakes and penalty areas.
- (g) No players shall have more than one (1) ball in play at any time.
- (h) All players shall repair ball marks on greens, replace divots and smooth sand traps before moving to the next tee.



- (*i*) Players stopping between nines must obtain permission from the Golf Shop to resume play.
- (*j*) The rules of golf adopted by the United States Golf Association shall govern all play, except as modified by the rules set forth herein.
- (k) Players shall observe the rules of golf etiquette as adopted by the United States Golf Association at all times.

Practice Range

- (a) The practice range is to be used only by Members and their guests (who are playing that day), as well as by Social Members immediately prior to their tee time.
- (b) The grass tee will be closed on Wednesdays for maintenance. The artificial turf tee will be used during this time.
- (c) Range balls are not to be removed from the driving range. Members and guests will observe all special rules concerning use of the practice range posted from time to time, including rules regarding the location of specific areas where practice may be temporarily prohibited, and hours of operation.
- (d) Golf attire is always required while using the practice range.



Storm Conditions and Weather Policy

When dangerous weather approaches, all players are to exit the golf course and come in to the clubhouse for safety. The Golf Professional may blow an air horn to notify players when the dangerous situation is imminent. ALL PLAYERS MUST LEAVE THE COURSE, PUTTING GREEN, AND RANGE WHEN THIS HORN SOUNDS AND ARE NOT PERMITTED TO RETURN TO THE COURSE, PUTTING GREEN, OR RANGE UNTIL THE GOLF PROFESSIONAL STAFF NOTIFIES THE PLAYERS THAT THEY MAY RESUME PLAY

JUNIOR PLAY:

It is the intent of this policy to balance two objectives:

- 1. Provide the opportunity for young men and women to learn and enjoy the wonderful game of golf, and
- 2. Ensure that adult Members have significant and appropriate access to the golf course and practice range.

No child under twelve (12) years of age is permitted to play the golf course unless accompanied by an adult, Member parent or guardian. Children under six (6) years of age are not permitted on the course at any time. Golf play by Juniors may be restricted to designated hours. Such hours may vary from time to time depending on season, and will be clearly posted in the golf shop. Adults have priority over Juniors at all times with regard to course availability, with the exception of Club Management sponsored Junior golf programs.

HOLE-IN-ONE CLUB:

- (a) All Full Golf, Limited Golf, Sports, and Social Golf Members of Ancala Country Club are part of the Hole-in-One Club.
- (b) A member, or spouse of a member, who makes an "official" hole-in-one will collect \$2.00 from all full golf members. The funds will cover the cost of a hole in one plaque, \$200 in golf shop credit book, and a credit towards the member's annual spending minimum.

(c) Hole-In-One Rules:

a. **An "official" hole –in-one must:**

- i. Be made at Ancala Country Club.
 - ii. Be made during a "score post-able" round of golf (at least 7 holes completed) or during a scheduled golf club sponsored event.
- iii. Be witnessed by at least 1 person 18 years of age or older.

b. Exception: A hole-in-one is <u>NOT</u> "official" if:

- i. It is made on a mulligan or multi-shot event.
- ii. It is made on a game hole with more than one hole.
- iii. It is made on a "temporary" green or tee.



LOCAL RULES SHEET

OCTOBER 2022

OUT OF BOUNDS: Defined by the inside edges at ground level by street curbing, fences, masonry walls and white stakes: a ball crossing a street and coming to rest on another part of the course is considered out of bounds. A ball is out of bounds when all of it lies out of bounds. (See Rule18.2 A & B)

PENALTY AREAS: Defined by Yellow or Red lines and/or stakes. (See Rule 17.1 D) Exception on Holes #9 and #18 – The margin of the Penalty Areas will be the outside edge of the concrete/boulders. If the outside edge of the concrete/boulders interfere with your stance or swing you are entitled to free relief under the Immovable Obstruction ruling. (See Rule 16-1) Note – This exception does not apply to Hole #18 greenside bunker.

ABNORMAL COURSE CONDITIONS: Cart Paths, Walking Paths, Drainage pipes, wooden steps, bunker maintenance entry/exit points, electrical boxes and the rock wall on the left hand side of Hole #7 are considered immovable obstructions and the player is entitled to free relief. Nearest point of relief, no closer to the hole, drop within one club length. (See Rule 16.1)

HOLE #9 CART PATH: If your ball comes to rest in between the purple stakes (right of the cart path), you are entitled to drop the ball within one club length on the grass side of the path no closer to the hole without penalty.

DRAINAGE ROCK PILES: You get relief from any rock pile that is a continuation of a drain pipe that is **on the golf course property** and not in a Penalty Area. These drain pipe tips are painted neon pink.

GREENSIDE SPRINKLERS: A player may take one club relief no nearer the hole and not on the green from a greenside sprinkler if the following conditions are met: a) The ball lies off the green, but not in a Penalty Area. b) The sprinkler is within two club lengths of the green or on the green and the ball lies within two club lengths of the sprinkler. c) The sprinkler intervenes on the line of play between the ball and the hole.

RELIEF AREAS HOLE #5 and HOLE #13: In addition to Red Penalty Area options (Rule 17-1), a player is also entitled to use the designated relief areas. The relief area on Hole #5 and Hole #13 are on the Silver tee box. The entire tee box is the relief area. (See Rule 14-3)

STROKE AND DISTANCE: If your ball is lost or out of bounds, under the new stroke and distance local rule, you may drop your ball in the designated area with a 2-stroke penalty. (See diagram on next page)

SPECIAL NOTES

DESERT CLUB: A 15th Club or Desert Club is **NOT ALLOWED** for events unless stated by the Golf Committee.



OTHER INFORMATION:

Members receive special member pricing on product in the golf shop. Members are entitled to a 20% discount on soft goods (anything wearable except for gloves) as well as price matches to other golf distributors on hard goods.

Arcis Access Play Days are to be held on the last Wednesday of every month. (Dates can be changed at any time by Club Management) On these days, Ancala Members who have purchased the annual Arcis Access program will be allowed to bring up to three (3) guests at the price of a cart fee. All other guests will be charged their respective fees.
