2024-25 GOLF RULES & REGULATIONS

GOLF RULES – HIGHLIGHTED FOCUS FOR 2024-25

- Bringing outside alcohol on property/course is expressly forbidden.
- The use of range balls on the golf course is strictly prohibited.
 - Violation of this policy could result in suspension of membership privileges.
- 5-somes may be allowed at the request of the member on the day of play at the sole discretion of the Head Golf Professional.
- Members must put player names into groups in ForeTees at the time of registration. The use of TBD, “X”, etc. will not be allowed.
 - **ANY** player on a reservation, where the time of that **reservation has passed** and did not play at the scheduled time will be subject to applicable cart and/or guest fees.
- Member’s, guests, and family must follow the posted, on course cart rules.
- All members, guests and family must follow the posted dress code regulations while on property.
 - Dress code is highlighted on page 39 (Collared shirts, closed toe shoes, no denim, etc.)
- All private golf carts must be registered with the club by November 1st, 2024, in order to be allowed on the property and must display the provided club sticker in the bottom left side of the windshield.
 - This includes signing the Private Cart Agreement and paying the respective trail fee.
- Pace of play: **“LESS THAN 2! UNDER 4!”**
 - Players are expected to keep pace with the group in front of them throughout the round. When necessary, a player’s assistant will help groups maintain acceptable pace. The following steps will be taken with groups well out of position.
 - 1st time out of position – The group must improve their pace within 2 holes.
 - 2nd time out of position – The group will be asked to skip forward to the position immediately behind the group in front of them.
 - 3rd time out of position – The group may be asked to leave the golf course.
- Respect of all fellow club members and staff by members and their guest is always expected. Verbal abuse or worse will be met with a zero-tolerance policy.
- Junior Golfer Access:
 - Any junior member under the age of 11 must be accompanied by an adult.

ANCALA CC CART POLICY

These policies are in place to help prevent unnecessary wear and tear on turf conditions and maintain golf course conditions at the highest possible level.

- When applicable, all Ancala golf carts must occupy 2 players (**maximum of 2 club carts per group**). If a player wishes to take their own cart when there is an available seat in another cart in the group, it is subject to approval by the Golf Professional Staff and will result in paying a \$60 cart fee for both seats.
- Golf carts must adhere to the signs regarding entering and exiting the fairways.
 - Do not drive closer to the green than the exit fairway sign. Approximately 40 yards from the green
- Keep a safe distance away from the bunkers and do not drive on the desert side of any bunker unless on the cart path.
- Only Licensed Drivers may operate golf carts on the golf course.

Ladies' Day will continue with tee times on Tuesdays starting in May and throughout the summer with optional individual Gross and Net Games based on participation. (A minimum of 10 players)

Play of the Day games and formats for each week will be advertised through the ACCWGA news updates and viewable on the ForeTees registration page.

Every Tuesday, ACCWGA members have the option to compete in the 18-hole competition, the 9-hole competition or play a casual 9-hole round without competition.

TEAM & MEN'S SEASON MATCH PLAY

Our 2024-2025 Season Match Play formats have options for all. All matches must be coordinated and finished within the allotted time frame. Any matches unable to meet the following deadlines will be decided by a coin flip unless an opponent concedes the match.

Please notify The Shop or make a note in ForeTees when booking the tee time so the golf staff can have match play scorecards prepared before your round.

Entry Fee: \$50 per player

2024-2025 SEASON TOURNAMENT POLICIES

a. Eligibility: ACC Golf Members

- Tournament eligibility requires a person to be a full golf member or spouse in good standing. All Club sponsored tournaments are reserved for Ancala Country Club members (and their guests if applicable).
- No PGA professionals are eligible to compete as a guest unless otherwise stated within the event.

b. USGA Handicap Eligibility

- All competitors in a competition must have an active, verifiable World Handicap System index or will play as scratch.
- A golf competition is any event where prizes of any type are to be awarded.
- The Tournament Committee, together with the Handicap Committee, reserves the right to adjust handicaps any time before or during a competition to ensure fair competition.
- Members are instructed to pass our requirements on to any guests they may invite to our competitions where guests are permitted.
- Maximum handicaps for competition, unless otherwise noted are: Men – 54; Ladies – 54.
- Cut-off dates for handicaps will be 48 hours prior to club events unless otherwise stated.
- See Handicap Committee page (in booklet).
- Ancala golf staff will post all tournament scores unless otherwise stated.

c. Rules of Play

- Pace of Play – Unreasonable Delay; Prompt Pace of Play: Rule 5.6 in the Rules of Golf shall be enforced. – USGA Rules of Golf are available in The Shop or through the USGA.
- Local Rules and Conditions of play will be in effect (also in this booklet).
- When the event allows, participants may play from the teeing ground that makes up at least 50% of their posted scores and the USGA handicap adjustment will be made.

d. Tournament Entries

- Sign up for events by contacting The Shop or by using ForeTees. The deadline for entry will be posted in ForeTees under the events tab.

e. Tournament Cancellation Policy

- If notified less than 24 hours prior to event: entrant will be billed ½ entry fee.
- If no notification is given, entrant will be billed the entire entry fee.

PRACTICE FACILITY POLICIES

- Ancala's Driving Range is strictly available only to Full Golf Members or any guests that are accompanied by a golf member that are playing the day of or other membership types that have a tee time on the day of.
- Driving Range hours are listed in this packet for the entire year.
 - They are subject to change and any changes will be announced via email and on the tee sheet.
- All full Golf Members must have an **Ancala Bag Tag** while using the Practice Facilities.
 - Please see the Golf Staff for your bag tag if you do not already have one.

TEE TIME RESERVATIONS

- The hours of course play, practice range hours and The Shop hours will be posted and are subject to change depending on course and weather conditions. The Golf Course Superintendent, in consultation with the Golf Professional, shall determine when the course is playable, and that decision will be final. No course play will be permitted during any period that the course is deemed unfit for play. In addition, when the course is closed, i.e., Mondays, there shall be no Member or Guest play.
- All players must be assigned a starting time through the ForeTees App. Starting times must be reserved through the ForeTees app or by calling The Shop. FULL Golf Members may reserve starting times up to seven (7) days in advance. Members may reserve only one (1) starting time (no more than 4 players) per request.
- All starting times shall be assigned on a first-come, first-served basis, and must be made via ForeTees. The person making the reservation will be responsible for that tee time.
- Players shall check in / register in The Shop or with the starter at least 10 minutes prior to their scheduled tee time.
- The golf course and practice facilities may be reserved for men's or women's play on certain days and during certain hours. Other players will be accommodated during these times on a space available basis only.
- Specific golf course rules and restrictions are applied / published periodically and are available in The Shop.
- A Wait List will be active each day to help alleviate high demand for tee times. This is included on each day's tee sheet. Members are responsible for names and adjustments.

TEE TIME REGISTRATION:

All members and guests must register in The Shop or with the starter before beginning play. Members are responsible for the payment of all cart and guest fees prior to teeing off. All play starts on Hole #1 unless permission to the contrary is obtained from the Golf Professional Staff.

Ancala CC Handicap Committee Policies 2024-2025

In Compliance with the requirements of the USGA, Ancala has an active handicap committee. The goal of our committee is to assure fair competition at all events at Ancala Country Club by making sure handicaps are accurate in accordance with the World Handicap System guidelines.

The Core Policies of the Committee are as follows:

1. Assure the proper posting of scores using Net Double Bogey as a maximum hole score.
2. Audit the posting of scores by comparing Scores Posted reports to the tee sheet. Our goal is that all rounds played in accordance with the Rules of Golf are posted.
If your name is on the tee sheet and you did not play, please delete your name, or ask the pro shop to do so. (If you plan on playing a round which does not have a postable score, example: you play a scramble, work on your short game, or do not play according to the Rules of Golf, please inform The Shop staff before playing).
3. Collect Scorecards for audit (and Scorecard Handicap Stroke Allocation purposes).
4. Work with the Tournament Committee to adjust handicaps when need be to assure fair competition.

We appreciate players efforts to adhere to the following:

- Return completed scorecards to The Shop. They will help us evaluate the hole handicaps. Your actual scores will help determine the ratings to be used in our competitions and for future re-rating evaluations by the Arizona Golf Association.
- **Keep a master scorecard for your group** and include players names, date, tee box played for each player and signature on the scorecard before submitting to the Golf Shop. **Please DO NOT keep individual scorecards in your group as we end up using an unnecessary excessive number of scorecards.**
- Post your score on the day of play. It is important to do so as handicaps are updated every night. Remind your playing partners to post on the day of play. Arizona has a year-round active season so all rounds are postable.
- The Shop will post your score on Ladies' Day and club events. If you would like them to post for you on another occasion, just ask The Shop and staff is happy to post for you.
- Your maximum score for posting purposes is par plus 2 plus your strokes (pops) for that hole (net double bogey). If you don't know how to determine your maximum allowable score per hole, ask The Shop to print a scorecard for you which will show your current pops for each hole.

Our goal is to make this a fun year by ensuring accurate handicaps for all golfers at Ancala Country Club.

PRIVATE ADULT AND JUNIOR INSTRUCTION

JUNIOR GOLF PROGRAMS

Our goal is to provide junior golf opportunities throughout the year to introduce juniors to golf. Operation 36 provides a fun atmosphere to learn and grow the game of golf.

Operation 36 Golf Academy:

- Ages: 6-12
- Skill Level: Beginner to Intermediate
- Time: Tuesday's 4pm – 5pm starting on October 29th for 9 weeks.
- Cost: \$345 per student

Operation 36 is a nationwide program that teaches students to score from the hole backwards. This curriculum is for a beginner to intermediate junior golfer, ages 6-13. We will teach your junior the fundamentals of posture, grip, alignment, and golf swing. We will cover putting, chipping, pitching, full swing and on course play. Learning to play golf at an early age teaches juniors sportsmanship, respect for the golf course and their peers. Our golf staff will work with your junior to develop the correct fundamentals of the golf swing. This semester lasts for 9 weeks.

INSTRUCTION PROGRAMS (cont.)

Next Level Junior Academy:

- Ages: 12-18
- Skill Level: Intermediate to Advanced
- Time: Thursday's 4pm – 5pm starting on November 7th for 8 weeks
- Cost: \$375 per student

Our Next Level Junior program focuses on the junior golfer ages 12-18 who have the fundamentals down and are looking to play tournament golf or for a golf team at the middle school/high school levels. We will teach these juniors how to maximize their golf swing with the proper swing sequence and complex muscle movements. We will also focus on determining what shot to hit and how to be decisive in this decision. How to be present over the ball and make an athletic move. How to store positive memory after good shots and be more neutral after other shots. Our Next Level Junior will then get to put these into practice on the golf course.

LADIES' CLINICS: 4P (Power, Precision, Putting & Playing)

- Skill Level: Beginner to Intermediate
- Time: Friday's 3pm – 4pm starting on November 8th for 4 weeks
- Cost: \$200 per student

How to create power in the golf swing and use it efficiently. How to have precision every aspect of your game including irons, driving and short game. We will teach the fundamentals of a putting stroke, grip, set up and alignment of the body over the ball. We will also show you how to identify break, identify grain and visualize the putt. This a 4-week clinic that meets on Fridays at 3pm beginning in November. The cost for this clinic is \$200.

BUILD YOUR OWN PERSONALIZED CLINIC

AVAILABLE FOR ADULTS AND JUNIORS | RATE: \$50 STUDENT/HOUR

This is a great opportunity for those that would like to get together with family members or friends for personalized golf instruction. The minimum clinic size is 3 students. The flexibility to select the time, frequency and instructor will create a comfortable learning environment.

Family Guest is defined as: the member's children over the age of 21, daughter-in-law, son-in-law, brother, sister, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, father, and mother.

No more than three (3) guests per member are permitted at any time unless approved in advance by the Head Golf Professional.

PACE OF PLAY @ ANCALA COUNTRY CLUB

Ancala Country Club takes pride in our pace of play. Our policy is that groups play in no more than four hours.

“LESS THAN 2! UNDER 4!”

(Less than 2 hours for 9 holes and under 4 hours for 18 should be the mindset to assist an enjoyable pace of play for all golfers on the golf course)

- If you would like to play more casually and at a slower pace, please play after 2pm during the season and let the faster groups play through.

We ask that you play **READY GOLF**:

Ready Golf means **BEING READY** to play when it is your turn.

Here are some simple tips to aid in your overall pace for the round.

1. Walk to your ball as soon as possible so you can choose your club and think about the shot in **ADVANCE**, not when it is your turn.
2. When driving a cart, drop off your partner first, let your partner choose his or her club, then drive to your own ball to get **READY** to play.
3. When another player's ball is lost, hit your shot **FIRST** and then help look for the lost ball. Search limit is 3 minutes.
4. Walk down the **SIDES** of the fairway to reach your ball and then **APPROACH** it when safe to do so. **NEVER** play in a caravan, moving in a group from ball to ball.
5. When on the Green, line up your putt **BEFORE** it is your turn to putt if not impeding another player's line of putt.
6. When on the tee, if the person with honors is not ready to hit first, ask if you can hit and play away.
7. Avoid spending too much time chatting on the tees and greens, especially when it is your turn to hit.
8. Proceed to the following tee before writing in scores from the last hole.

VIOLATIONS OF THE PACE OF PLAY POLICY WILL BE TREATED AS FOLLOWS:

1. First offense: verbally asked to pick up your pace
2. Second offense: you will be asked to skip a hole to regain position

If the same players continue to play in over four hours during busy times, a written notice will be sent to the player(s).

Tee times may be restricted to habitual slow players during prime hours.

Hole-in-One Club

- All Full Golf, Limited Golf, Sports and Young Executive Members of Ancala Country Club are part of the Hole-in One Club.
- If a member or spouse of a member makes an “official” hole-in-one (see below), they will collect \$2.00 from all Full Golf members. The funds will cover the cost of a hole-in-one plaque, \$200 in golf shop credit, and a credit towards the member’s account.

- **Hole-in-One Rules:**
 - **An “official” hole-in-one must:**
 - Be made at Ancala Country Club.
 - Be made during a “postable” round of golf (at least 9 holes completed), or during a scheduled club sponsored event.
 - Be witnessed by at least one person 18 years of age or older.

 - **A hole-in-one is NOT “official” if:**
 - If it is made on a mulligan or during a multi-shot event.
 - If it is made on a green with multiple holes/cups.
 - If it is made on a hole using a temporary green or tee.

USGA RULES GOVERN ALL PLAY

LOCAL RULES

- **OUT OF BOUNDS:** Defined by the inside edges at ground level by street curbing, fences, masonry walls and white stakes: a ball crossing a street and coming to rest on another part of the course is considered out of bounds. A ball is out of bounds when all of it lies out of bounds. (See Rule 18.2 A & B)
- **PENALTY AREAS:** Defined by Yellow or Red lines and/or stakes. (See Rule 17.1 D) Exception on Holes 9 and 18 – The margin of the Penalty Areas will be the outside edge of the concrete/boulders. If the outside edge of the concrete/boulders interfere with your stance or swing, you are entitled to free relief under the Immovable Obstruction ruling. (See Rule 16-1) Note – This exception does not apply to Hole 18 greenside bunker.
- **ABNORMAL COURSE CONDITIONS:** Cart paths, walking paths, drainage pipes, wooden steps, electrical boxes, that are not in Penalty Areas, and the rock wall on the left-hand side of Hole 7 are considered immovable obstructions and the player is entitled to free relief. Nearest point of relief, no closer to the hole, drop within one club length. (See Rule 16.1)
- **HOLE 9 CART PATH:** If your ball comes to rest in between the purple stakes (right of the cart path), you are entitled to drop the ball within one club length on the grass side of the path no closer to the hole without penalty.
- **RELIEF AREAS ON ALL PAR 3's AND HOLE 13:** In addition to Red Penalty Area options (Rule 17-1), a player is also entitled to use the designated relief areas. The relief areas on all Par 3's and Hole 13 are on the Silver tee box. The entire tee box is the relief area. (See Rule 14-3)

SPECIAL NOTES

- **PACE OF PLAY:** Please adhere to these Pace of Play guidelines. Ancala Country Club Pace of Play is two hours or less for nine holes, four hours or less for eighteen holes. Please allow faster players to play through.
- **COURSE CARE:** As a courtesy to your fellow players, please fill in all divots with divot mix, repair all ball marks on the putting surfaces and rake all bunkers.
- **ALL GOLFERS:** You are responsible for any injury to people or damage to property caused by your actions, including errant golf shots.

GOLF COURSE & PRACTICE FACILITY DRESS **CODE**

Men's Golf Dress Code – Proper Golf Attire:

Required for Men:

- Shirts with collars and sleeves, mock-neck golf shirts are acceptable
- Slacks or Bermuda shorts of no more than two inches above the knee are considered appropriate attire.

Not Permissible for Men:

- Shirts without collars, tee shirts, tank tops or workout shirts.
- Blue jeans, work jeans, sweatpants or warm-up suits.
- Swimwear, short shorts, cut-offs, gym shorts.
- Tennis outfits or other athletic shorts made for other sports are not permitted.

Women's Dress Code – Proper Golf Attire:

Required for Women:

- Tops or blouses intended for golf. A sleeveless top must have a collar. A blouse without a collar must have sleeves.
- Slacks, dresses, skirts, skorts and shorts intended for golf are considered appropriate attire.

Not Permissible for Women:

- Halter-tops, tee shirts and tank tops.
- Blue jeans, sweatpants, warm up suits or swimwear
- Tennis skirts and outfits, and athletic shorts made for other sports are not acceptable.

Shoes for All:

Appropriate golf shoes are required for all golfers. Golf shoes with soft spikes or treads are acceptable. Tennis shoes and other soft soled shoes are allowable. No metal spikes or aggressive treads intended for other sports are permitted.

The above Dress Code applies to the Golf Course and ALL practice facilities.

Ancala Country Club was built in 1989 by Rich Barton, developer of the Ancala residential subdivision. With a goal of creating one of the region's most outstanding full-service family lifestyle clubs, Barton engaged the iconic and the late Pete Dye (1925-2020) and his son, Perry, to build what is now considered one of the best championship layouts in the state.

The golf course consists of 60 acres of turf. It has a total of 54 bunkers equivalent to 4.2 acres of sand. The average green size is approximately 5,100 square feet. Green speeds average approximately 11 feet on the stimpmeter throughout the season.
